

Sport Characteristics

Sport selection is directly related to the importance of matching athletes and partners by ability. Each column in the chart below has sports that are grouped according to similar characteristics and team dynamics. These affect how teams are assembled based upon ability and age considerations; show how meaningful involvement is best achieved; present safety concerns; and describe how teams are to be awarded.
